Lylsens, Principia sign JV

AN AGREEMENT for the incorporation of the joint-venture (JV) "Principia-Lylsens Brunei Sdn Bhd" was signed yesterday between Lylsens Sdn Bhd, a 100 per cent Bruneian start-up company providing project management and engineering services in the Oil and Gas sector, and Principia, a French company belonging to the Principia Group, specialising in offshore engineering.

The JV agreement was signed by Laila POKS DSP Hj Md Saleh, the Managing Director of Lylsens Sdn Bhd and Benoit Valleteau de Moulliac, chairman and CEO (Principia Group) at Lylsens Sdn Bhd offices in Bandar Seri Begawan and witnessed by Thierry LeRoux, the Chairman of Principia Asia Sdn Bhd and Hjh Hidayati POKS DSP Hj Md Saleh, Director of Lylsens Sdn Bhd.
